The 2006 Louisiana Smoke-Free Act eliminated smoking in all public places – **except bars and gaming venues**. But comprehensive smoke-free ordinances have been changing that by protecting all public spaces and venues at the local level. #### The Dangers of Secondhand Smoke

Exposure to secondhand smoke causes an estimated

41,000

DEATHS each year among adults in the United States.<sup>1</sup>

Nonsmokers exposed to secondhand smoke at home or work increase their risk of developing lung cancer by

20-30%

Chronic cigarette smoking can negatively affect:

- Organizing, regulating behavior and meeting goals
- Cognitive flexibility
- Intellectual abilities
- Learning abilities and memory
- Working memory, such as remembering instructions or paying attention<sup>3</sup>

We will continue to work tirelessly with community partners and elected officials to close this gap statewide and **eliminate smoking in ALL spaces and places** – creating a healthier quality of life for all of Louisiana.



### **Progress, Progress, Progress**

20+ cities and parishes have passed comprehensive smoke-free ordinances, with even more up for a local vote this year!

Over 1 million Louisianans are protected from the dangers of secondhand smoke, which is 22.46% of the state. **Together, we can get that to 100%**.




# A Breath of Fresh Air for Bars and Gaming Venues

Smoke-free bars and gaming venues protect the state, protect workers and create a more enjoyable night out for everyone.


### Case Study: Hammond Bar Revenue
